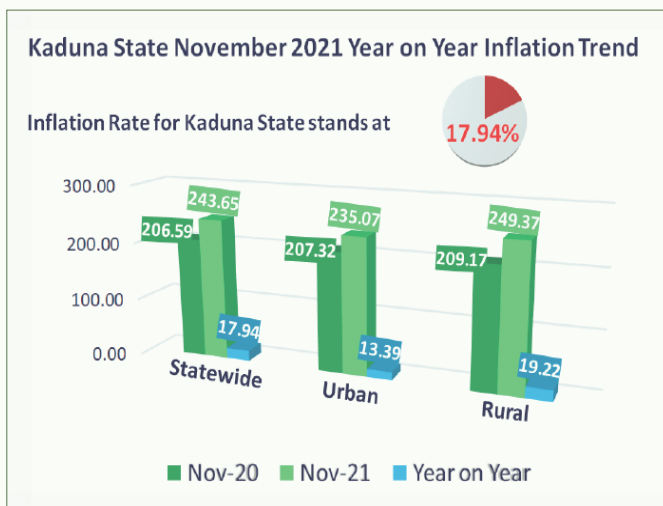

The Consumer Price Index – November 2021

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) year-on-year inflation rate for Kaduna State stands at 17.94% in November 2021. This was 0.03% lower than the rate of 17.97% recorded in October 2021.

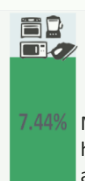
The major contributors to the year-on-year inflation rate in November 2021 were major household appliances, potatoes, yam and other tubers, bread and cereals, books and stationeries, and garments.

This implies that the prices of some goods and services decreased in November 2021 compared to October 2021.

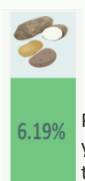

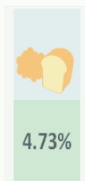
Absolute contributions to Kaduna State November 2021 month-on-month inflation rate

Potatoes, yams, other tubers



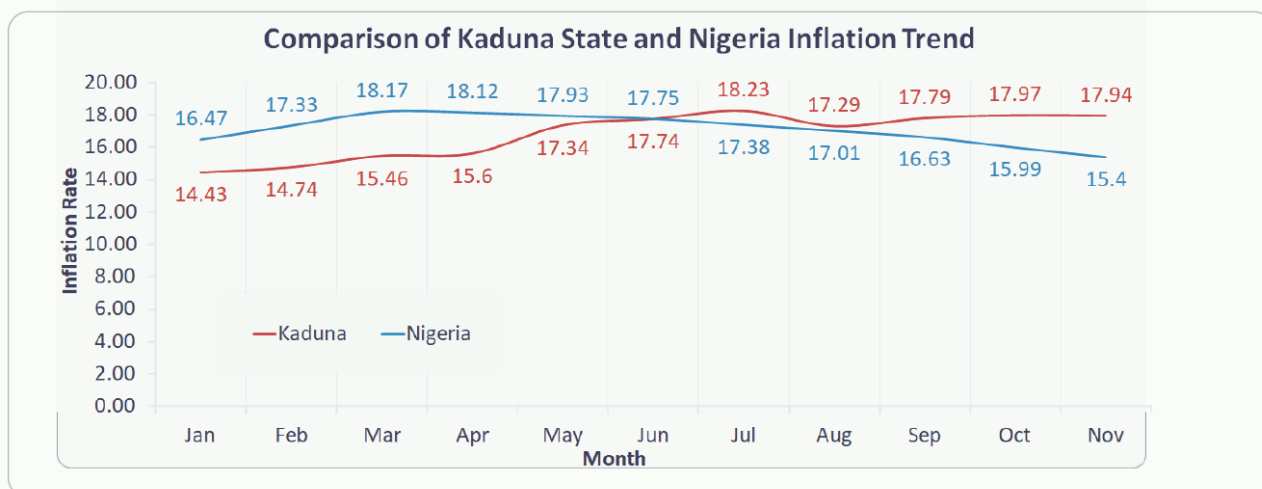
Bread and cereals

Garments



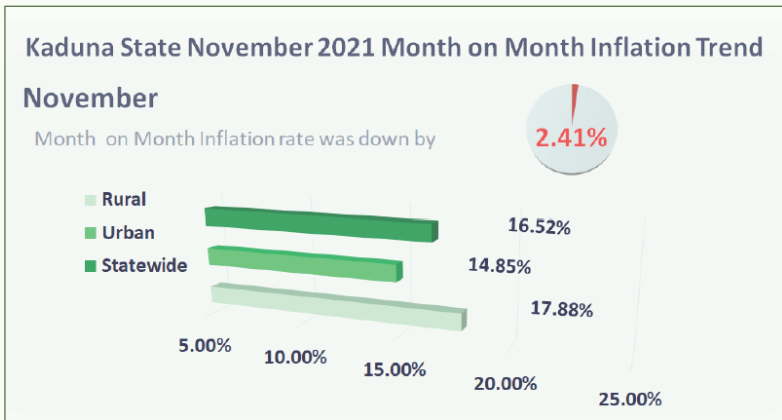
November CPI Index stands

The CPI Month-on-Month basis in Kaduna State shows that the State Index stands at 243.65% in November 2021 in comparison to the base year of 2009 (100%). The urban index recorded 235.07% while rural index recorded 249.37% in November 2021.

The State CPI Month-on-Month inflation rate was 16.52% in November 2021, down by 2.41% from 18.93% recorded in October 2021. The urban inflation rate was 14.85% in November 2021, decreased by 1.51% from 16.36% recorded in October 2021. The rural inflation rate was 17.88% in November 2021, decreased by 2.08% from 19.96% recorded in October 2021.

The Top Five Absolute contribution that influenced the decrease of the Month-on-Month November CPI inflation rate included major household appliances (7.44%), potatoes, yam and other tuber (6.19%), bread and cereals (4.73%), books and stationeries (4.32%), and garments (3.11%).

The highest contribution to the decrease of November 2021 Month-on-Month inflation rate was recorded in major household appliances (7.44%).

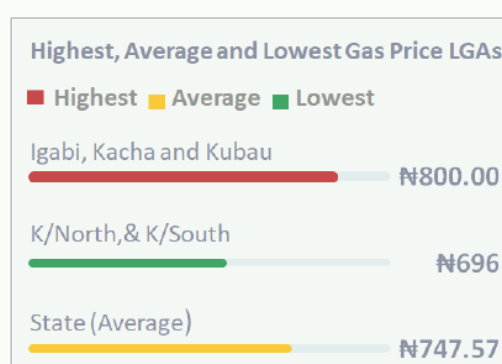
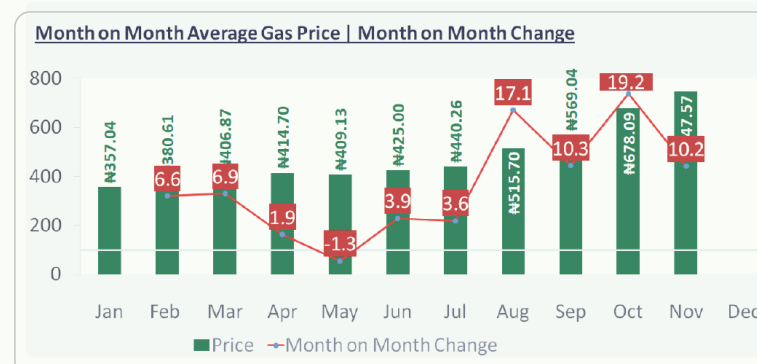
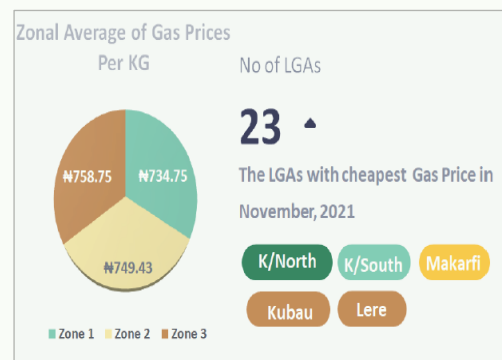
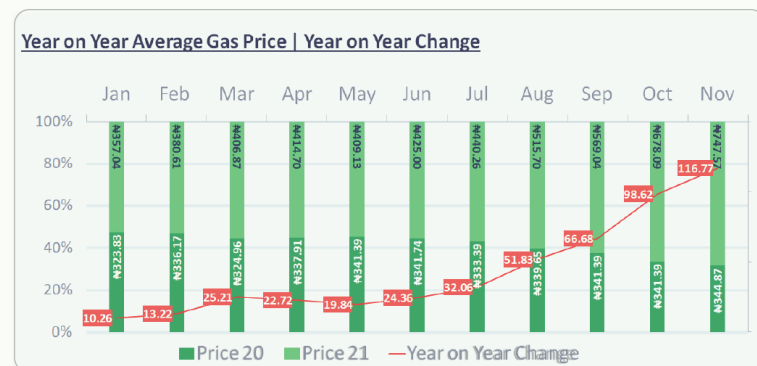
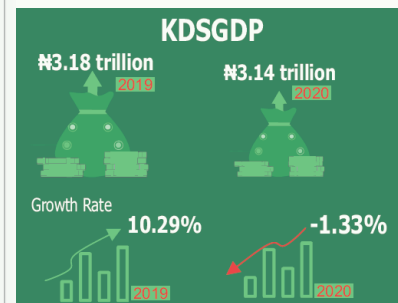
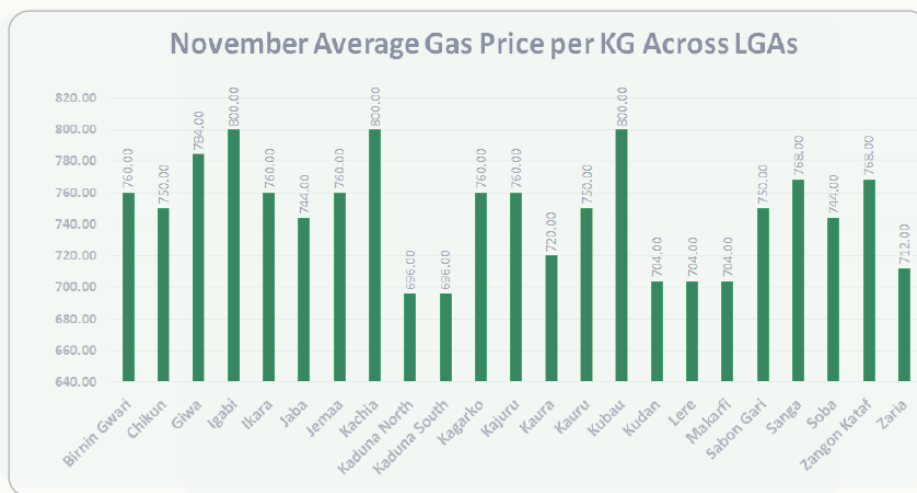
Liquefied Petroleum Gas (Cooking Gas) Price Watch

The Kaduna State Liquefied Petroleum Gas Average Price Watch is targeted at providing a monthly average change of Liquefied Petroleum Gas Average Price (per kg) consumed by people for day-to-day living as well as showing the year-on-year average changes in the State.

The average price paid by consumers for Liquefied Petroleum Gas (per kg) increased by 10.25% month-on-month, from N678.09 in October 2021 to N747.57 in November 2021.

It increased by 116.77% year-on-year from N344.87 in November 2020 to N747.57 in November 2021.

The Local Government Areas (LGAs) with the highest monthly average price of Liquefied Petroleum Gas (per kg) in November 2021 were Igabi, Kachia, and Kubau at N800.00 each. The LGAs with the lowest monthly average price of Liquefied Petroleum Gas (per kg) in November 2021 were Kaduna North and Kaduna South at N696.00.

The new Statistician-General (SG) of Kaduna State, Dr Saheed Salawu has reported to the Bureau of Statistics office since the 6th of December 2021. The formal handing over of the mantle of leadership to the new Statistician-General was done by the overseer, Mr Jonah Justus Yusuf along with other management staff of the Bureau on the 13th of December 2021.

Saheed Salawu is a graduate of Statistics from the University of Ilorin (B.Sc 2000). He also has M.Sc. in Statistics from Ahmadu Bello University (2006) and Ph.D. in Statistics from the University of Ilorin (2013). He obtained a Post Graduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) from Usman Dan Fodio University, Sokoto.

Dr Salawu is a trained statistician with specialization in Biometry and Computational Statistics. He has

skills in Data Analytics, Project Monitoring & Evaluation, System Strengthening, Management Information Systems, Policy Monitoring, Capacity Building, Education Account Analysis, and Project Sustainability Agenda. He has working relationship with local and international development partners including UNICEF (GEP II & III), UNOPS (Millennium Village Project), RTI (NEI), Oxford Policy Management (OPM), Matt Mcdonald (TDP), Creative Associates International (NEI Plus), Oando Foundation – Education Support, and the Development Research and Project Centre.
