SGs Speech on Q3 2023 Newsletter



Kaduna State Bureau of Statistics is the custodian of all activities that relates to official statistics in Kaduna State ranging from data collation, collection, analysis, interpretation, research, and coordination of statistical activities, which aids policy formulation, development planning and evaluation of accomplishment. The Bureau is mandated to coordinate the State Consultative Committee on Statistics (SCCS). The SCCS is one of the mechanisms that propel the state statistical system.

During the quarter under review, the Bureau hosted the 2nd SCCS meeting for the year 2023, which is centred on generating accurate, reliable, and timely data on persons with physically challenges. Hence, the theme of the SCCS meeting is "Enabling Inclusivity: Advancing Data Collection for persons with physically challenge in Kaduna State". Physically challenge inclusion is an essential condition to upholding sustainable development, peace and justice. It is also central to the promise of 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goals; to leave no one behind. The commitment to realizing the rights of persons with special needs is not only a matter of justice; it is an investment in a common future. Data for persons with special need is essential to be able to develop evidenced-based policies to monitor the implementation of inclusiveness in the state and to measure progress towards state targets, as well as to take stock of the challenges that remain unresolved.

Bureau had the honour of hosting Bill and Melinda Gate Foundation's (BMGF) country office team at the Amina J Mohammed SDGs Data Lab. The Bureau Championed the engagement with discussion around the remarkable accomplishment of the BMGF-funded Data Lab project and call for more partnership. Bureau showcased the milestones recorded by the project and how data is driving decision making and policy formulation in the State.

In the guest of tracking Sustainable Development Goals Implementation in the State, KDBS in collaboration with state SDGs Office funded by UNDP, trained its staff on data collection for Kaduna state SDGs survey and successfully conducted it. The survey is aimed at collecting data on SDGs indicators for the assessment and evaluation of government policies and implementation. The Survey covered all the 23 LGAs. In same direction the Bureau also built the capacity of MDAs Statistical Desk Officers on System of Administrative Statistics (SAS) data collection on SDGs. This is geared towards having a robust reporting of SDGs for the State. Kaduna State Bureau of Statistics has been supporting the state SDGs office in providing information for timely reporting of the SDGs at the state level. Kaduna State has reported on the progress of the SDGs in 2017 and 2021.

During the quarter under review the Kaduna State Bureau of Statistics, in collaboration with

Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation through the Natview Foundation for Technology Innovation has officially inducted the 40 fellows into the Data Science Fellowship Programme (DSFP) 3.0. The Fellowship Programme stands at the heart of the Kaduna State commitment to human capital development. DSFP equips the 40 young people with skill in Data science. This will further translate to championing evidencebased decision making. The Fellowship, which was launched by the Kaduna state government in 2020 under the Data Lab Project, is part of the state's Data Revolution Plan, which aims to strengthen coordination in the collection and use of data for evidence-based decision-making. The core objective of the project is developing human capital around data science and the use of data for decision-making.

Finally, I will like to employ on all to trust our work process and leverage on the skills and technology evident in the bureau in building an informative process in the state. The Bureau is open to support everyone to produce facts to power logic and common good. The Bureau will continue to deliver on its mandate of producing quality statistics for the state for informed decision making.

The objective of the capacity building was to ensure that System of Administrative Statistics data collection by all MDAs contribute to SDGs reporting for Kaduna State.


Topics covered during the capacity building were:

- b. Mapping of the goals, targets and indicators of the SDGs by the MDAs Statistical Desk Officers.


The Consumer Price Index – Third Quarter, 2023.

he consumer price index, (CPI) which measures inflation rate increased to 26.83% (year-on -year) in September, 2023. This is 0.90% higher than the rate of 25.93% recorded in August, 2023. This shows that price of goods and services slightly increased in September, 2023 when compared to the inflation rate recorded in August, 2023.

Data for the Small Firm Diaries Project was collected from firms, spread across 3 states -
